

STUDY LAB POLICY

SPRING 2011

The College of Engineering and Mineral Resources (CEMR) is committed to student success. Study labs are the result of student suggestions and are designed to help students get off to a good start in college. Students who get off to a good start, typically, do well in college. Student feedback indicates that students want more help in Math, Chemistry, Physics, and Engineering courses, students need more structure to develop good study skills, and students learn as much from other students out of class as they do from faculty in class.

Study labs offer academic assistance in the following subjects:

- Chemistry (110 and 115);
- Physics (111);
- Math (MATH 126A/B/C, 128, 129, 153, 154, 155, and 156); *and*
- Engineering (ENGR 101, 102, and 199).

Students may meet the study lab requirement by:

- Spend at least 2 hours (in two 1-hour sessions or one 2-hour session) each week working on homework or studying at the Engineering Learning Center in G111 of the Engineering Sciences Building. This learning center will be staffed with upper level students to help you five days a week:
 - Sunday: 4:00-8:00PM
 - Monday – Thursday: 9:00 AM -8:00PM
 - Friday: 9:00AM-4:00PM

The Engineering Learning Center is staffed by upper level students engineering undergraduate or graduate student tutors who help students with any questions they may have while working on homework or studying for a class. These tutors also help students review for major exams. Study labs are open to all engineering students, but are **required** for those students taking ENGR 101, ENGR 102, and ENGR 199. The study labs are also required for students on academic probation.

You are required to go to study labs and you are required to bring work with you. If you have no homework, you can bring your textbook and read ahead of your class, or bring additional problems to rework. You will not be allowed to stay in the study labs if you have no work. You may not read leisure books, play video games, watch movies, or sleep.
